<b>HB133</b>	Revises the definition of abortion to require medication abortion be provided only at licensed abortion facility. <b>Author:</b> Representative Frank Hoffmann <b>Outcome:</b> PASSED and sent to the Governor. <b>Vote (House):</b> 1N - 89Y <b>Vote (Senate):</b> 5N - 32Y
<b>HB425</b>	Constitutional Amendment to prohibit abortions and public funding for abortions with no exceptions for rape and incest. <b>Author:</b> Representative Katrina Jackson <b>Outcome:</b> PASSED both Houses. After negotiations with the bills author, the date was changed and the amendment will now be on the ballot in November 2020. <b>Vote (House):</b> 10N - 81Y <b>Vote (Senate):</b> 5N - 33Y
<b>HB484</b>	Imposes strict requirements for abortion clinics regarding record retention, requiring, in some cases, patient records be kept for up to 30 years, even if a clinic is closed before then. This bill includes strict criminal and civil penalties for violations. <b>Author:</b> Representative Raymond Crews <b>Outcome:</b> PASSED and send to Governor. <b>Vote (House):</b> 1N - 91Y <b>Vote (Senate):</b> 4N - 30Y
<b>SB184</b>	Ban abortions around six week ban, with no exceptions for rape and incest. <b>Author:</b> Senator John Milkovich <b>Vote (Senate):</b> 5N - 26Y <b>Vote (House):</b> 23N - 79Y
<b>SB221</b>	Require doctors providing abortions to provide, in writing, information about their qualifications that no other medical provider is required to provide. <b>Author:</b> Senator Beth Mizell <b>Outcome:</b> PASSED and Signed by the Governor - Act 198 <b>Vote (Senate):</b> 0N - 38Y <b>Vote (House):</b> 13N - 82Y
<b>HB536</b>	Provides for the regulation of birthing centers <b>Author:</b> Representative Stephanie Hilferty <b>Outcome:</b> PASSED and Signed by the Governor - Act 332. This bill was supported by Birthmark Doulas. <b>Vote (House):</b> 99Y - 0N <b>Vote (Senate):</b> 37Y - 1N

Economic Justice	
<b>SB5</b>	End the state and local sales tax on diapers and feminine hygiene products. <b>Author:</b> Senator J.P. Morrell <b>Outcome:</b> This bill made it to Conference Committee where it failed to receive the number of signatures needed in the Senate. <b>Vote (Senate):</b> 29Y-5N <b>Vote (House):</b> 98Y - 0N
<b>SB136</b>	Prohibit pay secrecy which is critical to ensuring Equal Pay. <b>Author:</b> Senator J.P. Morrell <b>Outcome:</b> PASSED Senate Labor Committee. FAILED to get a full vote in the Senate. <b>Vote Senate Committee:</b> 4Y-2N
<b>SB155</b>	Allow people to vote on a Constitutional Amendment to raise the minimum wage to \$9.00/hour. <b>Author:</b> Senator Troy Carter <b>Outcome:</b> PASSED Senate Labor Committee. FAILED to get a full vote in the Senate. <b>Vote Senate Committee:</b> 5Y-1N
<b>SB186</b>	Enact the Paid Family and Medical Leave Act, which was supported by a broad coalition of organizations. <b>Author:</b> Senator J.P. Morrell <b>Outcome:</b> Passed Senate Labor Committee. No hearing in the Senate Finance Committee. <b>Vote Senate Committee:</b> 4Y-1N
